Third Quarter 2018 Highlights

Continued monthly **Food Truck Fridays** through August and **Fridays at the Fairgrounds** through October, as well **summer concerts** in June, July and August.
Additionally, the Fairgrounds' first all-day July 4th celebration was held this year.
Thousands of people came out to enjoy these new events and the spirit of community they fostered! Thank you to everyone who helped make these new summer events successful!





Joined members of the **Sawnee Association of the Arts** to hold a grand opening for the new **Downtown Arts Center**, located inside the City's historic **Brannon-Heard House (111 Pilgrim Mill Road)** in August. The new Arts Center is open every Thursday, Friday, and Saturday from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. offering art displays and demonstrations, a range of classes, a gift shop, and bistro serving coffee and tasty treats.

Established the **Cumming Country Fair & Festival Advisory Board**, comprised of 14 community members who will focus on improving the guest experience of the fair. The board's inaugural meeting was held on Aug. 2 and their second meeting is slated for Oct. 24. At that time, members will discuss their ideas for improving the fair and will create a list of recommendations to present to the Mayor and City Council.





Approved an agreement with Square Ice, Inc. to present an outdoor ice skating rink at the Cumming Fairgrounds from Thanksgiving to early January. The rink will be offered daily and in conjunction with several other holiday-themed events throughout the season, including a Jeep holiday event Dec. 1-2, the annual Christmas in Cumming arts and crafts sale Dec. 7-8, and the City's new Christmas parade through downtown Dec. 15 beginning at 5 p.m. and followed by a Christmas festival at the Fairgrounds with Santa!

Adopted revisions and additions to the **City's Zoning Ordinance**, including the creation of a new **Planned Unit Development Category** which will allow for more flexibility and creativity of developments within the City.

Adopted revisions to the **City's Sign Ordinance** to help create more pleasing aesthetics throughout the City, and approved advertising for bids for construction of **new Welcome to Cumming signs**, which will feature electronic messaging for City events and paid advertising.

Approved an agreement with Forsyth County regarding **Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) VIII**, in which the City will receive an estimated \$14.495 million for various capital improvement projects such as new roads and improvements at Dobbs Creek Recreation Center.

Completed several road repaving projects, including Hickory Ridge, Ingram Avenue, and Tribble Gap Road.

Launched our **new cityofcumming.net website** which offers a fresh, modern look and new features.
