First Quarter 2018 Highlights

Promoted former Assistant City Administrator **Phil Higgins** to the role of **City Administrator**, following the retirement of the former City Administrator in December; eliminated the Assistant Administrator position to save the City substantial salary and benefit costs.

Bid out several of the City's contract services to lower costs; awarded the garbage pickup services contract for residents within the City Limits to **Red Oak Sanitation**, which will **add curbside recycling** once a week at no additional cost to citizens, while saving the City approximately \$160,000/year.



Approved a study to evaluate the City's Planning & Zoning fees to **potentially institute impact fees so new development contributes to increased infrastructure costs**; adopted a temporary building and development moratorium during the approximate 6-month study to allow time to **plan for responsible future development in the City**.

Adopted the City's first **Noise Ordinance** for residents and businesses within the City Limits, and named a **Code Enforcement Officer** to ensure City Ordinances are properly enforced.

Dissolved the Cumming Fair Authority to **return full control of the Cumming Fairgrounds to the Mayor and City Council**; we are currently in the process of establishing a **Fair Advisory Board**, which will be comprised of 5 to 20 members from the community who will make recommendations to the Mayor and Council concerning ways to improve the Cumming Country Fair & Festival.

Partnered with the Forsyth County School System and Sheriff's Department to hold their annual **Ghost Out and Teen Maze** event on March 24 at the Cumming Fairgrounds at no cost; previously rotated among the 5 public high schools, this venue change allows students from all Forsyth middle and high schools, as well as private and homeschool students and parents, to attend the event.



Established a new Cumming Fairgrounds' event: **Fridays at the Fairgrounds**, which will be held every third Friday during warm-weather months **beginning April 20** featuring food trucks, a cruise-in car show, live music, hot air balloon rides, and inflatables and games for kids.

On the Horizon

Establishing **additional community events**, including a music festival in early summer and expanded July 4th event at the Fairgrounds, as well as a Christmas parade through downtown ending with a large-scale Christmas festival at the Fairgrounds.

Laying groundwork for **creation of the City Center**, a community gathering space featuring walkable retail and restaurant spaces, small-scale event venues, and green spaces.

Looking for **cost-saving measures** across all City Departments, and **fostering community partnerships** to bring positive economic development projects to the City.
