I. There was a Work Session meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Cumming

on Tuesday, January 3, 2023, at 6:00 P.M., at City Hall in Cumming, Georgia. The Mayor

and all Council Members were properly notified as required by law and all were present.

Mayor Troy Brumbalow presided over the meeting and called the meeting to order.

VIII. New Business A. Administration: 1. 2023 Sanitation Rates: City Administrator

Phil Higgins explained the current Solid Waste Removal contractor, Red Oak Sanitation

has notified the City of a rate increase of \$.55 per customer would go into effect on April

1, 2023. This increase is due to higher fuel and labor costs and higher dumping fees.

Unfortunately, we have no other choice but to increase the customer rate stated Higgins.

An increase of \$1.50 per customer would cover the added costs mentioned. (see attached

rate schedule) A motion was made by Christopher Light and seconded by Chad Crane to

increase the customer rate by \$1.50. The motion carried unanimously.

B. <u>Planning and Zoning</u>: 1. Cumming Design Review Board Appointments: Planning Director Scott Morgan explained that the recent amendment to the Zoning Ordinance to include Design Review requires the appointment of one Planning Commission member and two Councilmembers to make up the Design Review Board. A motion was made by Joey Cochran and seconded by Jason Evans to appoint Planning Commission Chairman Ralph Webb, Councilmember Christopher Light and Councilmember Chad Crane to the Cumming Design Review Board. The motion carried unanimously

C. <u>Utilities</u>: 1. Water and Sewer Master Plans: Director of Utilities Jon Heard explained that the State of Georgia requires that each City and County that are a part of the Metropolitan North Georgia Water Planning District, create and update a Water Master Plan and a Sewer Master Plan every 5 years. Our previous Master Plans were adopted in 2017. These Plans are used as a tool to guide and schedule system improvements, system expansions, and aging infrastructure replacement projects. The Department of Utilities requests the Mayor and City Council to adopt the Water Master Plan and the Sewer Master Plan to help maintain compliance with state law and remain qualified for grants, low interest loans, and water and sewer permit increases. A motion was made by Chad Crane and seconded by Linda Ledbetter to adopt the Water Master Plan and the Sewer Master Plan as presented by the Department of Utilities. The motion carried unanimously.
